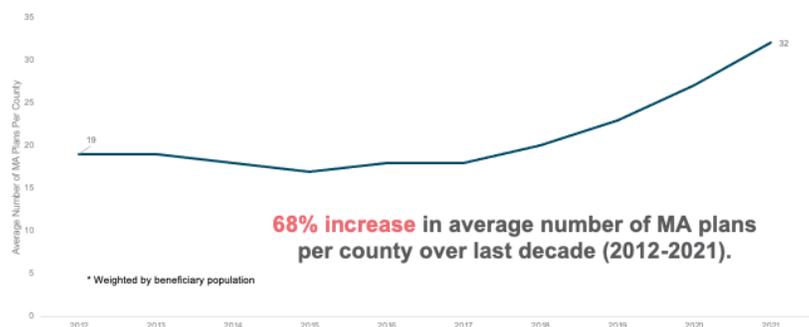

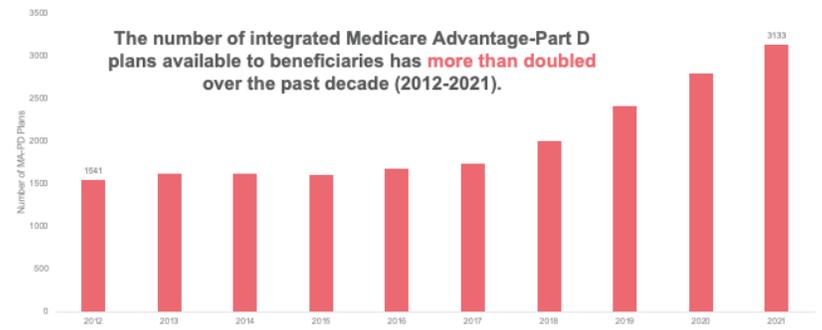
Average Number of MA Plans per County*

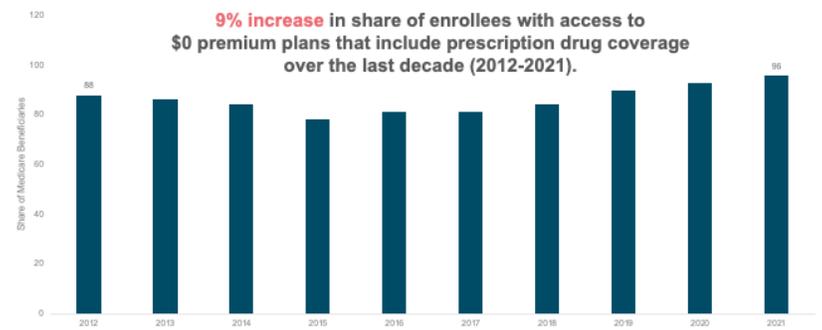
Availability of MA-PD Plans
