## Delivering for Seniors

### **30+ million**

Americans choosing Medicare Advantage for their coverage and care.

### **93%**

Senior voters with Medicare Advantage who are satisfied with their coverage.

## Saving Money for Americans

### **\$18**

The average value of extra benefits Medicare Advantage enrollees have, as a direct result of Medicare Advantage plans' negotiations, innovations, and value.

### **85%**

Cost for Medicare Advantage plans to deliver the basic Medicare benefit, compared to original Medicare.

### **7%**

Percent lower Medicare Advantage spending, compared to original Medicare on an apples-to-apples basis, as of 2019. That's real savings for taxpayers.

### **50% Less**

Net improper payment rate in Medicare Advantage, compared to original Medicare.

### 9 million

Medicare Advantage enrollees have an income below 200% of the federal poverty level.

### 63%

Medicare Advantage enrollees are aged 70 or older.

### 57%

Medicare Advantage enrollees are women.

### 32%

Medicare Advantage enrollees are racial/ethnic minorities – compared to 21% of original Medicare enrollees.
